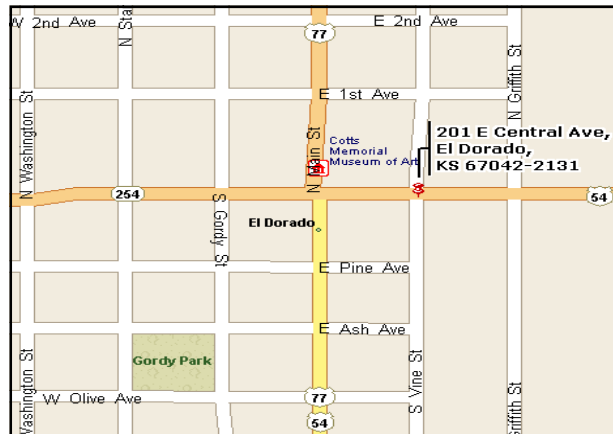


General Information:
